## Technology Hints for 2011

In the modern life with technology, it is never too late to protect your personal data, privacy and security. There are some New Year's technology tips which will help you not to worry with 2011 technology. For significant data, you need backups of backups. It means that you should have multiple copies of your backup data and store them in many places. For instance, firstly, one copy of your backup data is stored in a desktop with two terabyte (TB) Hard disk drives which cost around \$80 with a USB 3.0 external enclosure. For this capacity you can backup all the data in your personal computer daily. Secondly, you can use online backup services such as Mozy, Carbonite, Backblaze, Amazon S3, iDrive, Norton Online Backup, and SOS Online Backup which are the most highly rated services. Most of these services are called “set it and forget it”. These services run continuously in background to backup your data.

Nowadays, social networking websites like Facebook, MySpace, Twitter, or Bebo are becoming more popular. In these websites, people share their personal information and even photographs without setting the privacy which determine who can see or cannot see their personal profiles. Many social networking websites are designed so that one's information can be searched easily by searching through search engines such as Google, yahoo....etc. The tip for protecting your privacy is to login in your social networking sites and then determine your privacy setting. For example in Facebook, click on Accounts menu, select Privacy Settings, and then configure your account.

A recent study has shown that most people use the same password for everything. Those passwords are not secure. According to the research conducted by RockYou.com, most of the commonly used passwords are “123456”, “password” and “iloveyou”. Passwords are extremely important because it can protect one's financial data, credit cards, banking account...etc from the hackers. So, one should be serious with their password security. Many browsers grant “Remembering Passwords Option” which should be ignored.

“Phishing” refers to the practice of trying to get your account information, personal identifying information, or anything else that scammers can use to gain access to your money. It attacks in all possible ways such as by sending you an email by acting as legal financial institutes or official agencies and trying to convince you to log on to your account or ask for personal information. Moreover, phishing can be executable applications in case you install it in your computer it can extract account information or steal other important information. Thus, the tip to overcome the online fraudsters is not to respond to any external request which require you to log on to your bank account or grant your bank account information verbally or by email. Additionally, make sure your antivirus is up to date and full-featured. Moreover, your data should be encrypted properly by using some standard application like BitLocker or open source application like TrueCrypt.

## Another Telecom Scam?

On a beautiful morning, I received a text message from my mobile subscriber ‘Standard SMS Tariff shall apply for all Local/National/International SMS on New Year (31.12.2010 and 01.01.2010)’. . These days are marked as black out days by the telecom companies. I had taken a 30 days SMS subscription pack for my connection whose validity was expiring after the New Year. I called up customer care to confirm the validity of the pack and after minutes of struggle with various options and inputs, finally chump on the other side told me the same. My mind started quizzing me that if I have paid for 30 days subscription, why I am getting benefit of 28 days? If the companies wish to celebrate black out days on the festive days why they have taken full amount for the subscription of that month on which these days fall? Why I pay the amount for that day moratorium which charges me standard Tariff? Considering 700 million mobile users in India which is now beyond that and considering only 10 percent of the users use these packs and considering the average charge to avail free SMS is Re 1, on an average this amounts to 700000000. Normally number of such days are 5 in a year so this amounts to  $700000000 \times 5$  which is 350 million. And when I multiply this amount with the number of years since this practice started, my old age calculator refuses to provide me an answer. Since the number of subscribers of these packs are not known anywhere except possibly to TRAI even if we consider only 1 percent users, the amount is substantial. But who should be held responsible for not giving attention to this? Telecom Minister, TRAI, DOT , Telecom companies? It is completely understandable on the company’s part not to provide free SMS on a voluminous day in terms of SMS but it seems pretty logical that they either should refund the amount charged or extend the validity by the number of black days on that month. I think we don’t need a JPC for this but a intellectual person either in the Ministry , DOT or TRAI who should be veteran in handling these tactics used by the telecom companies to increase their revenues on their festive days and for people’s black (out) days.

Looking at the clock again and again after getting back!

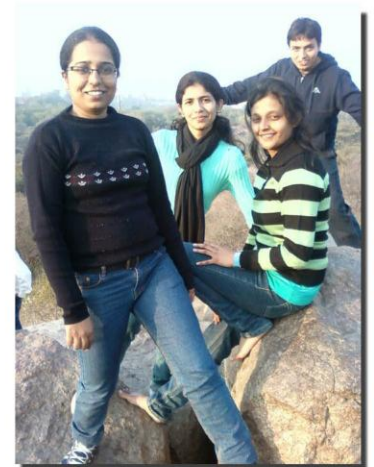
Staying awake till late at night, no worry about the next morning alarm.
